For the last few months we have given notice of our return to three Masses on a Sunday from 7th November. We still do not have a rota for enough volunteers for these Masses yet but will run a trial from Nov. '21 to Feb.'22 to see if this is possible.

Please remember that we pray the Rosary every week before Mass on Fridays at 9am, during this time a period of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction before the 9.30 Mass.

Church Synod 2021/22: Every person matters to the Lord and his Church, every voice matters and every story is important.

Pope Francis has asked the Catholic Church worldwide to engage in a process of discernment under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. This process is called a synod, and is a programme of making our way together in faith, united in Christ the Way, the Truth and the Life. The worldwide Synodal process is guided by a fundamental question: How does 'journeying together' take place today in different levels of our lives? In our Archdiocese, Archbishop John is inviting everyone to respond to the invitation of Pope Francis and take part in the initial diocesan listening phase of the Synod. Therefore, our Parish is hosting a dialogue process, where conversations about the Church's mission in the life of our community and the diocese can be prayerfully examined; and where the will of the Lord can be discerned, as we seek to grow in faith and number.

In the parish of St Mary Magdalen we will be holding a reflection meeting on Sunday 14 November, starting with Mass at 6.30pm. The Synod questions will be available to all several weeks in advance as we invite both online and written submissions beforehand so that as many people as possible can participate. If you would like to take your part in the Synod process but cannot attend the meeting on 14 November, please email MortlakeAdmin@RCAOS.org.uk with SYNOD 21/22 in the title so that the series of questions can be emailed to you. Further details on how we can all respond to the Synod will be provided in future newsletters as we would be delighted to hear from you and to receive your responses.

The Church continues its mission of inviting others to join the Way: the Synod process is important in the life of the Church since, as everyone journeys together, listening first to the Lord in their heart and then speaking openly and listening with each other, we learn to hear the voice of the Lord speaking to us. The Holy Father wants the Church to grow in three key areas: Communion, Participation and Mission. By growing together in Communion, the people of God deepen their Participation in the life of the Church and so become more effective disciples in Mission to our families, to our community and to the world.

Thank you to Children's Liturgy Helpers Past, Present and Future: it's been a great blessing over the years to have had many parents and children be a part of the 9.30 Mass children's liturgy. We aim to build another wonderful team together and have 11 families involved so far. To help plan for our children's work in Advent Fr Adrian will be inviting volunteers to a Zoom meeting at the end of Half Term on Sunday 31 October at 6pm. Our 9.30 Mass resumes on 7 Nov. but as all volunteers need to have CRB certificates as part of our Safeguarding please keep 21 Nov. free after the 9.30 Mass as Reps from the Diocese will help volunteers with the forms.

The Catholic Bishops of England and Wales invite the faithful to pray a novena, nine days of prayer, seeking the intercession of Pope Saint John Paul II, to help defeat the 'Assisted Dying Bill 2021'. The Bill will receive its Second Reading, with full debate, in the House of Lords on 22 October. If successful, it will allow terminally ill adults with less than six months to live, assistance to commit suicide. Catholics are encouraged to pray the novena with short daily reflections to uphold the infinite worth of each human person through proper investment in palliative care. Bishop John Sherrington, Lead Bishop for Life Issues, said: "Jesus told his disciples to pray at all times and not lose heart. Providentially the discussion of Baroness Meacher's Bill in the House of Lords falls on the feast of Saint John Paul II on 22 October. "The novena, asking the intercession of Pope Saint John Paul II, who spoke courageously about the infinite worth of each human person and witnessed to the cross in his final illness, calls upon Catholics and all who share our view that assisted suicide is wrong, to pray with perseverance that this Bill will be defeated.
