Our Easter Newsletter is sent out on Good Friday to remind us of what's happening at the end of Holy Week and into Easter: GOOD FRIDAY IS A DAY OF FASTING AND ABSTINENCE:

Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays and on Good Friday in particular, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the year. The season of Lent began by reminding us, in addition to fasting and prayer, that the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts, not only through the distribution of money (treasures), but through the sharing of our time and talents as well.

As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2446).

The Church's Code of Canon Law (Can. 1252) reminds us that the age at which abstinence becomes binding is 14.

Abstinence, in this particular case, means abstaining from meat. The obligation of fasting is restricted to those who have completed their 18th year and it continues until they have begun their 60th year. Fasting means a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller portions of food may also be taken if need be, but they are not to equal that of a full meal.

Please remember, if anyone of an age to fast or abstain is unwell, they are exempt.

Fasting, Abstaining, Prayer and the proper use of our Time, Talents and Treasures are not limited to just Lent or simply Fridays, but we are always encouraged to share in Spiritual and Corporal works.
