It is important to note that the obligation for each of us to attend Sunday Mass continues to remain suspended.

The church remains temporarily closed for repairs and lockdown restrictions during the week. We are also temporarily closed at the weekend for Covid-safety reasons so our Sunday 11am Mass is livestreamed via Zoom.

Parish Details for Ash Wednesday, 17 February

From 9am to 10am - Holy Hour of prayer and music before the Blessed Sacrament, with the imposition of Ash at 9.55am.

At 7pm Mass will be **online only** via Zoom



Three weeks ago the newsletter announced that we have to face the reality of how, with Parish members rightly choosing to stay safe at home, **we can only open the church for specific occasions, most especially**

funerals, when we are able to draw on volunteers who are not shielding and can help with the strict cleaning regime. The safety of our volunteers and all our Parish members is paramount, which is why, given limited numbers available to help, we have to plan vary carefully when we can open.

Given this, our Mass for Ash Wednesday, 17 February, will be online only at 7pm.

However, Fr Adrian will lead a Holy Hour of prayer and music before the Blessed Sacrament from 9am to 10am this Wednesday 17 February, ending with the imposition of Ash at 9.55am, sprinkled on the crown of the head as per Vatican instruction. Fr Adrian will be on hand to make all the preparations if need be, as there may be no Stewards but, as per Government regulations, the doors of the church have to be left wide open. If you would like to attend at any point during the hour, please just turn up and sign in. Please consider bringing antiviral/antibacterial wipes with you so that you can wipe down anywhere you may have touched.

Shrove Tuesday (the day before Ash Wednesday) has become known by many as Pancake Tuesday

Usually at this time of year, school supporters from across England and Wales get ready to hold fundraisers through Mission Together, Missio's children’s branch, in the form of pancake races and flipping contests. However, due to COVID-19 many of these events cannot take place and without these fundraising activities, Missio cannot raise funds or reach all the families around the world who need their help. While people are largely at home, and often only communicating online, Mission Together have come up with a way to take their fundraising effort online as well. They are inviting everyone to join in their online ‘Flipping Fantastic Fundraiser’ in which everyone can take part: all you have to do is make a pancake and get sponsored to flip it as many times as possible.


How to get involved:

The Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes was celebrated on the 11th of February and is also known as the **World Day of the Sick**. Saint John Paul II inaugurated this day in 1993 as a day of prayer for the sick and the suffering. This year for the 29th World Day of the Sick, Pope Francis has taken the theme, “You have but one teacher and you are all brothers” (Mt.23:8), calling for “a trust-based relationship in our care for the sick”. The Pope reminds us that “sickness always has more than one face: it has the face of all the sick, but also those who feel ignored, excluded and prey to social injustices that deny their fundamental rights. ... A society is all the more human to the degree that it cares effectively for its frail and suffering members, in a spirit of fraternal love ... to empathise with those who suffer”. He urges us to strive to achieve this goal. During this last year many have ministered lovingly for the sick, the vulnerable and the forgotten. Let us continue pray for God’s blessings and strength for them. We pray we may help them to know that the healing hands of the Lord are upon them as we turn to God and the Lord.
